## 701 Center for Contemporary Art in Columbia, SC, Features **Exhibit of Contemporary Art**

The 701 Center for Contemporary Art in Columbia, SC, will present the inaugural 701 CCA South Carolina Biennial 2011, featuring works by 23 artists and one artist team of two from South Carolina currently producing some of the most exciting contemporary art in the state. The exhibit will be presented in two parts: Part I: Oct. 6 through Nov. 13, 2011, and Part II: Nov. 17 through Dec. 21, 2011. Receptions will be held on the following days: Part I: Friday, Oct. 7, 2011, 7-9pm and Part II: Thursday, Nov. 17, 2011, 7-9pm. Admission to receptions are free for members, non-members, \$5 suggested

2011. The invited artists live across the state. Their ages range from the mid-20s to mid-70s. Eight are South Carolina nacontinued above on next column to the right tives, twelve were born elsewhere in the United States, and five were born abroad. The artists' work presents a wide range of media, from painting, drawing, collage, photo transfer, prints, sculpture and crafts to installation, performance and more.

The artists' selection took place through an Invitation Committee of 12 arts professionals from across the state. Each committee member was asked to select two artists for Biennial 2011 plus an alternate. Alternates replaced selected artists who either were unable to participate in the *Biennial* or had already been selected by another Invitation Committee member. A 701 CCA curatorial team will select works created in the past three years for inclusion in the exhibition from the selected artists.

701 CCA has opted for the current selection process for several reasons – (a) as an experiment to be reviewed afterward for future 701 CCA South Carolina Biennial exhibitions; (b) 701 CCA's limited resources; and (c) time restraints, which made it necessary to use a speedy selec-
