Woolworth Walk in Asheville, NC, will present Cottages and Acres, featuring works by Sarah Faulkner, on view in the FW Front Gallery, from Oct. 1 - 30, 2016. A reception will be held on Oct. 7, from 5-7pm.

Cottages and Acres is a show celebrating the rural architecture and open spaces of the Appalachian mountains. Faulkner revisits her woodworking past to produce a series of whimsical lamps designed after historic cottages, farmhouses and barns found throughout the landscape of the surrounding Asheville area.

"When judging an exhibit I look for excellence in execution of the medium." Jameson said. "In all media, from painting to craft, I also look for balance. A work of

art can be beautifully executed but weak in composition which, to me, is the single most important factor. Drawing, color harmony, use of light and dark are also important in achieving balance but there is another factor. It is the aesthetic quality, the sometimes undefined quality of a work that gives it a special beauty. It's the piece that draws the eye from 30 feet across a room.
