Dwight Rose is a graduate of the Ringling College of Art and Design earning a BFA degree in painting. He went on to teach both in Ringling's degree and community art programs and VCU School of the Arts in Qatar. Over his 30-year career Rose has won numerous awards and his work has been included in many collections and exhibitions. He currently resides and works with his wife Ruth Beals in Spartanburg where he conducts workshops, exhibits and teaches watercolor painting at the Art School in the Chapman Cultural Center.
