During those years, his family made several trips to Europe, and time spent on both continents further developed his passion for color, form, and texture. In 1978 he moved to Charlotte, NC, to advance his art education, and in 1981 he moved to Hawaii and joined the Oahu Artists Guild in 1985. In 1988 he moved back

to Charlotte and continued to work as a professional multi-media artist. His work is in private and corporate collections across the continental US, as well as Hawaii, Canada, France. The Netherlands, and Great Britain. Corporate clients and interior designers currently seek his abstract paintings.


