



eration later in life, when sculpture became her new means to work with forms she had long painted. The tactile exhibit will include clay sculptures by Mary Carlisle, adjunct art professor, as well as students and alumnae.

The Georgia O'Keeffe Centennial is a year-long celebration of the artist's transformative time as a professor of art at Columbia College in 1915. The Centennial is presented by the Michael J. Mungo Foundation in memory of Jennifer Mungo and is in partnership with the Columbia Museum of Art and South Carolina Educational Television.
