Classically trained as a nature illustrator, she uses images found in nature to create beautiful surrealistic figurative mindscapes that are emotive, sensual, and at times provocative. Eggleston interweaves art with poetry, moving smoothly from one creative expression to another to help the viewer both see and feel her intent. Her work has been seen in various galleries around the Carolinas and Virginia.


