Burroughs-Chapin Art Museum in Myrtle Beach, SC, Offers Exhibit Focused on Mickey Spillane

The Franklin G. Burroughs-Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum in Myrtle Beach, SC, is presenting *I*, *the Writer: A Collection of Mickey Spillane Memorabilia*, on view through Apr. 20, 2014.

For fans of mystery novels and films, the name Mickey Spillane has been a familiar one for nearly seven decades; more than 200 million copies of his books have sold internationally, including seven of the top 15 all-time best-selling fiction titles in the US. As a longtime resident of Murrells Inlet who died in 2006 (at the age of 88), Spillane's cachet is even greater along the Grand Strand.

Those fans will have a not-to-be-missed opportunity to relive their memories of Spillane's work and life. The exhibition is accompanied by a series of public events featuring the books and films created during Spillane's long career and highlighting the legacy of his work.

Presented in conjunction with Coastal Carolina University's OLLI division and The Athenaeum Press, this wonderful collection of memorabilia borrowed from the Spillane residence in Murrells Inlet, SC, offers a glimpse into the fascinating life of one of the best-selling pulp fiction writers of our time.

Items in the exhibit include original hardback, paperback and comic book covers and posters promoting Spillane novels; photo stills from Spillane's Miller beer commercials; photographs and illustrations; and even a vintage manual typewriter used by the author.

Burroughs-Chapin Art Museum in Myrtle Beach Offers High School Art Exhibition

The Franklin G. Burroughs-Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum in Myrtle Beach, SC, is presenting the *Horry-Georgetown County High Schools 13th Annual Juried Art Exhibition*, on view through Apr. 20, 2014.

Local high-school artists will have the opportunity to win cash prizes, make sales and experience a museum showing of their work with this exhibition.

Cash prizes awarded by Carolina Radiology Associates, LLC. include Best in Show in either 2D or 3D (\$500); First (\$100), Second (\$75) and Third place (\$50) in both 2D and 3D works; plus eight Honorable Mentions two of which are sponsored by the Waccamaw Arts & Craft Guild, (\$25) in three 2D and three 3D.

Schools participating are: Aynor High School, Carolina Forest High School, Conway High School, Georgetown High School, Green Sea Floyd High School, Loris High School, Lowcountry Preparatory School, Myrtle Beach High School, Myrtle Beach Academy for the Arts, Sciences & Technology, North Myrtle Beach High School, Socastee High School, St. James High School and Vine and Branches.

More than 350 pieces were submitted for consideration in this year's competition and 77 pieces were chosen to be displayed at talent as a visual artist in Cuba despite government-imposed restrictions on art expression and the resulting constraints on making a living as a professional artist. In 2007, Llanes relocated to the United States. Settling in Naples, FL, he immediately immersed himself in educational opportunities to learn English and began the process of establishing his US citizenship. For two years, he worked alongside world-renowned artist Jonathan Green at Green's studio. In 2009, he was offered the position of Artist in Residence at Jonathan Green Studios. Shortly thereafter, he moved with Green and his staff to Green's new studio in Charleston, SC, where he currently resides and works. In 2011, Llanes exhibited his work at the Art Museum in a solo exhibition, Preserving a Cultural Heritage: The Coffee Paintings of Revnier Llanes. In addition to painting, Llanes is learning art management methods and is representing fine art created by professional artists who continue to live and work in Cuba.
