

Lander University in Greenwood, SC, Offers Outdoor Sculptures by Students

Lander University's Department of Visual Art presents *Go Outside*, an outdoor exhibition of sculpture through September 30, 2014, on its campus in Greenwood, SC.

Lander University art students Andrew Catterton, Brandy Cessarich, Tyler Frasier, Abby Jordan and Travis Taylor created and installed sculptures for this temporary installation as a part of their Advanced Sculpture course. Each student chose a location from several sites designated for sculpture exhibits on Lander's beautiful campus. The sculpture sites are located all across campus and viewers are invited to get outside and enjoy the works of art while being active.

These five sculptures join two other new outdoor sculpture installations at Lander which were created and installed during Lander's "Sculpture Deathmatch II; War of the Welds" on Apr. 19, 2014. During this event two teams of sculptors compete to design, create and install outdoor sculptures in a 12 hour time frame.

All seven works of art may be viewed by the public on the campus of Lander University, 320 Stanley Avenue, Greenwood, SC.
