The Craven Arts Council in New Bern, NC, will present two new exhibits including: *Bank of the Arts National Juried Exhibition*, on view in the Main Gallery, from July 1 through Aug. 31, 2022, and an exhibit of works by Lee Tripi, on view in the Director's Gallery, from July 1 - 31, 2022. A reception for both exhibits will be held on July 8, from 5-8pm, at the Bank of the Arts. Another reception will be held on Aug. 12, from 5-8pm.

This biennial exhibition is Craven Arts Council's signature exhibition featuring over 100 artworks out of 440 entries. The exhibition will feature work by artists across the country as far as California and as close as right here in New Bern.

*The Bank of the Arts National Juried Exhibition* showcases a wide variety of artworks within five categories: Contemporary Craft, Indoor Sculpture, 2D, Photography and Outdoor Sculpture. This year, the Craven Arts Council is offering \$5,000 in awards, including the \$1,500

CAC&G Permanent Collection Purchase Award. The exhibition's juror is Maya Brooks, the Mellon Foundation Assistant Curator at the North Carolina Museum of Art.

Craven Arts Council is proud to present the work of Lee Tripi in the Director's Gallery for the month of July. Tripi is a local painter known for his large textured paintings.

Tripi is a self-taught painter and designer originally from Akron, OH. He started painting when he was about 8 or 9 years old with a beginner watercolor kit. Much of his aesthetic is Asian inspired, so simplicity and texture play a large role in his works. As a result, contemporary abstracts and conceptual portraits are the themes that interest him the most. He often uses a combination of water mixable oils and acrylic for the under-painting relying on the thick oil paints to help build up texture.

## Burgwin-Wright House and Gardens in Wilmington, NC, Features Works by David A. Norris

Burgwin-Wright House and Gardens in Wilmington, NC, is presenting *Streets, Streams, and the River: Finding Inspiration in Wilmington*, featuring works by David A. Norris, on view through July 16, 2022.

Norris' work reflects the landscapes of the places where he has lived or visited. Through his interest in art history, his work has absorbed influences of English watercolors, 19th century engravings, Japanese woodblock prints, Dutch Baroque landscapes, and Van Gogh's reed pen drawings.

From North Carolina, Norris has a BFA degree from the East Carolina University School of Art, and has long settled in the Port City. Wilmington is where he finds the historic atmosphere and the natural beauty of the Cape Fear River; the creeks and ponds; and the Atlantic coast provide him with limitless sources of artistic inspiration.

Much of Norris' recent work features wildlife and landscapes seen in the artist's daily walks. Some of these works are done

in color pencil on watercolor paper toned with an ink wash. In the last couple of years, Norris has worked with monoprints and oil paintings, as well as ink drawings with brush or pen.


