

born and raised in Wilmington, Delaware. She earned her BFA as a painter from the Rhode Island School of Design in 1987 and her MFA from the University of Texas at San Antonio in 2010. A mid-career artist, Pell has had solo exhibitions at contemporary art centers throughout the state, a coveted residency at Artpace San Antonio (2006), and has been included in group exhibitions at the museum level for over a decade.

"This is my first solo show at a major American museum," says Pell. "It is such an incredible opportunity to have all of my work together in a large enough group so that I can take people on a journey together through the different ideas. I am really look-

## **University of South Carolina in** Columbia, SC, Offers Works by Wendy DesChene & Jeff Schmuki

The University of South Carolina in Columbia, SC, will present *PlantBot 2.0*, a collaborative exhibition by artists Wendy DesChene and Jeff Schmuki, on view at the School of Visual Art and Design's Mc-Master Gallery, through Oct. 11, 2018.

PlantBot 2.0 is a collaborative effort of two artists and educators, Wendy Des-Chene and Jeff Schmuki, who satirically look at the possible evolution of plant species through modern agricultural practices and share current scientific knowledge on the environmental and social costs of bioengineered crops. Genetically modified plants are grafted onto robotic and remotecontrolled bases to become an organism with no clear heritage and no clear future. Through these humorous street interventions with robot plant hybrids, the artists aim to begin conversations about food issues. PlantBots are a hybrid of imagina-
