A reception will be held on Oct. 7, from 5-9pm.

The show celebrates our European heritage with artists from England, Scotland, and France. England's Ian Mason paints with a technique of thin washes and bold lines that at first appear loose and uncontrolled, but are actually careful and deliberate. The result rewards the viewer with a depth of sensitivity rarely seen in contemporary art.

Also featured in the exhibit are works by photographer Alain Foussier. Originally from France, currently living in the Netherlands, Foussier strives to capture the mood and spirit of the animal in front of his lens. He has three photographs hanging in the AKC Museum of the Dog in St. Louis. David McEwen, a Scotsman, who now continued above on next column to the right | resides in the South of France, lives up to

the Scottish tradition of great storytelling through his narrative paintings. His work has won numerous prestigious awards and International Artist named him a "Master Painter of the World."

Finally, England's classically trained artist Hazel Morgan's client list includes several royal households across Europe and breeders in the Middle East and the US. Working from the inside out, she captures the unique soul of every subject. The intimacy she brings to her work conjures loving memories and creates legacies.

Owner Jaynie Spector comments, "We are so pleased that Americans take this genre of art seriously, as the English have for centuries. Even with the highs and lows of our economy, our staying power can be attributed to the sophistication of the American public. Our stable has grown and continues to represent the best quality artists currently working with animals."
