8th Annual Bluffton Arts & Seafood Festival Takes Place in Bluffton, SC - Oct. 14 - 21, 2012

The Bluffton Arts & Seafood Festival is back for the eighth year - and still growing. What started as a one-day event in 2005, has quickly become a week of festivities in historic Bluffton, SC, showcasing the arts and locally harvested seafood. Festival events are scheduled Sunday, Oct. 14 through Sunday, Oct. 21, 2012.

The traditional opening ceremony, the Blessing of the Fleet and Boat Parade on the May River, will again kick off the week of festivities at 4pm on Sunday, Oct. 14, but will be preceded by the newest festival addition, the "Friends of Bluffton Artists" 1st Annual Invitational Showcase of Local Art, a celebration of exceptional hand made, original local art. Enjoy strolling this outdoor art exhibit from 11am – 4pm on Calhoun Street and then finish at the Church of the Cross for Gospel Music and the Blessing of the Fleet and Boat Parade.

On Monday (Oct. 15) evening at 5:30pm a Tour of the Waddell Mariculture Center and Low Country Boil (reservations required) will take place with Al Stokes on the bluff of the Colleton River. Thursday (Oct. 18) offers another new event, The Outback Excursion, a scenic boat tour of the backcountry creeks and rivers coupled with kayaking. Friday night (Oct. 19) is Family Night at the Promenade Park offering environmental activities, story telling and movies for children and the young at heart.

Other favorite returning events include daily May River kayak tours, author night, the Saturday morning revamped "Art-Sea" Dash replacing the traditional 5K, the children's fishing tournament, boat tours, and the Saturday and Sunday Street Fest. This Street Fest includes live music, "Iron Chef" competition & Chefs' Auction and of course the highlight of the week, the juried Artist Showcase on Calhoun Street. Over 100 artists from 10 different states including 15 from our very own Beaufort County will be showcasing and displaying their fine art; local restaurants and caterers will be serving up delicious seafood dishes and Low Country Cuisine; and area environmentalists will be highlighting our natural resources and the necessary conservation practices to ensure their continuance.

1st Annual Invitational Showcase of Local Art

The Bluffton Arts and Seafood Festival officially kicks off with something new this year. On Sunday, Oct. 14, the week-long event will include the inaugural "Friends of

Bluffton Artists" showcasing the original work of over 60 local, low country artists on opening day. The showcase will run from 11am until 4pm in Old Town followed by the Blessing of the Fleet at Church of the Cross. Bluffton's celebrated arts community has come together with an idea that the popular Arts and Seafood Festival should not only end with an Arts finale, but start with one as well. This unique showcase is a celebration of handmade, original local art by the artists who have contributed to making Bluffton an art, shopping and dining destination.

A centerpiece and model for future years will be the unveiling of a major work unique to Bluffton. This year a true Bluffton "mascot" created with repurposed and recycled objects by long-time local artist Kelly Graham promises to be a crowd pleaser. Graham also designed the official Arts and Seafood logo eight years ago and artist Amiri Farris will be on hand to autograph the limited edition Arts and Seafood posters he created.

Bluffton's arts community has evolved over the last half century and today continues to contribute to the special flavor of the historic Old Town culture. Visitors to the Arts and Seafood Festival opening day festivities will be able to "Love Bluffton and Buy Local." Participating artists include many of the artists responsible for the birth of the Bluffton Arts District, nationally recognized local artists, artists represented by long-time gallery owners, and artists with The Society of Bluffton Artists (SoBA). Mediums included are sculpture, oil, acrylic, mixed media, watercolor paintings, jewelry, photography, wood carving, glass, hand painted furniture from some long-time local artists and some new to the community. Many of the participating

artists give back to the community, some regularly teach in our schools and some at SoBA. Some artists volunteer their time in various children's art programs. Local non-profit organizations regularly call on Bluffton's local artists to contribute to and support events that improve the quality of life in our community. Local musicians will provide additional entertainment and some artists will be
