The exhibition features work by the artists in media ranging from textiles to artglass, photography to basketry, 3D assemblage to collage, clay to sterling, and printmaking to painting in watercolor, pastels and oils. At the gallery entrance, visitors will see a display of photos of the artists' hands as they create their art.

Finally, Carrol Kay weaves fibers into colorful wraps and accessories; Barbara Snow includes printmaking along with her oil and pastel paintings; Marci Tressel captures the Lowcountry in haunting black and white photography; and Carol Williams creates imaginative art from 'found' materials.

Art League of Hilton Head on Hilton Head Island, SC, will present *Enduring Realism*, an exhibit of works by two classical realistic painters, Dennis Lake and Heather Wanamaker, on view in Walter Greer Gallery at the Coastal Carolina Art Center, from Oct. 7 - 29, 2014. A reception will be held on Oct. 9, from 5-7pm. An artist's tour of the exhibit will be held on Oct. 18, at 11am.

Realism has endured for centuries representing nature through individual observation. Lake's and Wanamaker's paintings in oil and watercolor skillfully capture life's beauty by fully developing realistic paintings in the classical tradition using many of the centuries-old techniques of the Old Masters. These artists don't just replicate a landscape or still life, but strive to get to the soul of what they are painting to create a feeling or to tell a story.




