Redux is open to the public Tuesdays through Saturdays each week with no admission fee to view exhibitions, and open





Rogers is best known for her architectural pieces, from roofscapes to Charleston landmarks. For this show, each of her works represents a structure of some sort – though the works certainly aren't limited to architecture. A structure is defined as "an arrangement of parts, elements,"

"I love painting Charleston's historic homes and buildings, but for this show I was also inspired to seek out some unlikely architectural subjects, [such as] old seafood shacks, rustic barns," says Rogers. But her concept of structure goes beyond brick-and-mortar buildings. "Each painting juxtaposes a man-made structure against organic structures, such as clouds and trees."

Rogers' life has always revolved around art. Raised in a household of artists, her mother Betty Anglin Smith and her twin sister Shannon Smith Hughes are also highly regarded artists. Her brother, Tripp Smith, is an accomplished photographer. The family now owns Anglin Smith Fine Art in the French Quarter of Charleston. Her works have been featured in galleries along the Eastern Coast from St. Simons, GA, to Martha's Vineyard. Her works hang in many prominent corporate and private collections including Walt Disney World, the Family Circle Cup in Daniel Island, SC,
