Newman taught painting at The Shore Institute for Contemporary Art and the Albany Museum of Art, but was drawn to teaching emotionally disturbed and autistic children. He earned his Masters at Bank Street College of Education in 1968 and later his Doctorate in Special Education from Rutgers University.

After retiring in 1994, Newman began painting artistically again. His earlier works are highly influenced by the art scene and his contemporaries of 1950s

New York City, and have evolved to a radiant study of the complexities of the human condition. The Director of the Institute of Contemporary Art, D. Ferrari, has said that Newman, "often varies the application of his pigment utilizing the degrees of luminosity achieved between the soft washes and glazes," and that his paintings are "always grounded to some degree in the figurative."
