The exhibition will highlight current visual arts faculty from the Governor's School: Marty Epp-Carter, Ben Gilliam, Elaine Quave, Joseph Thompson, Carolyn Tucker, and Paul Yanko.

The SC Governor's School for the Arts and Humanities is a public residential high school located in Greenville, SC. Founded in 1999, the school gives emerging, artistically talented high school students from across the state the opportunity to study one of five arts concentrations - Creative Writing, Dance, Drama, Music, and Visual Arts - in a supportive environment of artistic and academic excellence. In addition to rigorous pre-professional arts training, students receive an intense and innovative academic education that fosters connections to the arts while meeting all the requirements necessary for a South Carolina high school diploma. The nine-month residential program is modeled after a master-apprentice community with an arts faculty composed of active artists. Faculty included in this show are both educators and practicing artists with rich backgrounds of expertise in their medium, and frequently exhibit their work, exemplifying for their students a commitment to a creative life. As part of an ongoing effort to support and show appreciation for South Carolina's art educators, the college's annual invitational explores the diverse studio arts train-
