## **North Carolina Pottery Center** in Seagrove, NC, Features Bunny **Schroeer's Pottery Collection**

The North Carolina Pottery Center in Seagrove, NC, will present A Collector's Collection, featuring 40 works from the collection of Bunny Schroeer, on view from Feb. 18 through Apr. 22, 2017. A reception will be held on Feb. 18, from non-2pm.

North Carolina is home to many pottery aficionados who are remarkable people not just for their collections, but also for who they are as people and for the passion they share for preserving, collecting, and sharing knowledge about our state's rich pottery tradition. Many of those collectors have given pieces to the North Carolina Pottery Center over the years, something which the center deeply appreciates.

A Collector's Collection focuses on forty exemplary art pottery pieces from the collection of Bunny Schroeer. As is the case in all museums, large and small, there is never enough space to permanently display everything held in permanent collections. Many of the pieces in this collection will be on display long-term at the center, but we felt all these extraordinary pieces needed to be displayed together for a bit of time to showcase the remarkable skills of our state's early art potters, as well as hopefully inspire another generation to collect, learn, and continue enhancing our understanding and knowledge of North Carolina pottery. The original entrance for the school, which was later known at the Country Life Academy, is now the entrance to the new School House Gallery at STARworks. The School House Gallery will feature work from STARworks staff artists, interns and resident artists, as well as local ceramic artists and glass artists from across the Southeast. Regular business hours will be Monday through Saturday, 9am to 5pm. STARworks is a Central Park NC project. Central Park NC is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the economy of the region by focusing on the sustainable use of our natural and cultural resources. STARworks is located at 100 Russell Drive in Star, just off Exit 52 on I-73/74 in northern Montgomery County.
