The Crooked Creek Art League is presenting its *19th Annual Juried Exhibition*, on view at Crooked Creek Park in Chapin, SC, through Mar. 31, 2014. A reception and awards presentation will be held on Mar. 17, from 6-8pm.

This exhibit will showcase upwards to 100 pieces of art by local artists, both amateur and professional members of the CCAL. Many different styles of art, as well as media, will be on display. The art work will line the halls of this Irmo-Chapin Recreation Center and is open to the public on a daily basis.

This year's juror is Diarmuid Kelly. Kelly is a photo realistic oil painter that moved his family from Ireland to the United States in 2008. Currently living in Greenville, SC, he is a self taught artist and has been painting professionally since 1997. Kelly has received National and Inter-

national recognition for his realistic animal paintings, as well as numerous SC awards for landscapes, still lifes, and portraiture. His work can be seen in many prestigious homes of art collectors in Ireland, England, Wales, Australia and the United States.

The Camden Archives & Museum in Camden, SC, is presenting *Robert Mills' South Carolina's Architect*, showcasing highlights of "South Carolina's Architect", on view through June 20, 2014.

The exhibit, features a range of works from the man who is considered "South

Carolina's Architect," including multiple versions of the *Mills Atlas of the State of South Carolina*, a collection of charts and maps produced from 1825 to 1980. The atlas is still considered a go-to piece of cartology and research material for historians

and genealogists alike.

The discovery of an 1838 edition of the atlas prompted staffers to develop a feature exhibit on Mills, who once wrote that Camden was one of the most prominent sites of his architectural career. His work in Camden includes the Historic Robert Mills Courthouse, Bethesda Presbyterian Church and the DeKalb Monument.

Camden is a small town of approximately 7,103 residents and is located 30 miles northeast of Columbia, SC. Camden fami-

lies and residents enjoy a top notch school system, beautiful local parks and green spaces, as well as community activities and local events throughout the year. The Southern Pottery Workcenter & Gallery in Columbia, SC, is presenting *All Things Alice*, an "Alice in Wonderland" inspired multi-media installation by NC artist, Leanne Pizio, on view through Mar. 15, 2014.

Through Pizio's talents she has interpreted the characters from "Alice in Wonderland" in tableware using the sgraffito technique, larger than life ceramic sculptures, linoleum prints and a painting of Alice herself.
