Nina Liu and Friends presents an exhibition of recent black and white photographs by Michael Johnson entitled, *The Last Picture Show*, on view from Apr. 4 through June 30, 2014. A reception will be held on

The large format silver/gelatin prints in this exhibition feature subtle gradations of tone that range from white through multiple, seductive shades of gray and black.
