For the Calabash show, Kinnison was influenced by nature unfolding around her, the ocean and waterways, the marshlands. In Ascending, she says, "I see an angel flying upwards. This painting gives me chills. I love the texture. It was created with sand from Wrightsville Beach, NC. It also has gold metallic paint in it that reflects when the light hits.'

Gallery owner Ginny Lassiter says, "I'm in awe of Kami's work. Her clay pieces whether they're hand built or thrown on the wheel - are so tactile, so organic. And her paintings are so full of emotion and excitement, it's hard not to be moved."
