The Black Mountain Center for the Arts 8th annual Art in Bloom puts the "fun" in fundraising. Art has the potential to stimulate intellectually or emotionally. For the series Visual Cues, Jane Wells Harrison is consciously exploring the idea of our tendency to draw conclusions based on how something looks. When viewers contemplates the work, the image can provoke an experience that mingles visual data with memory, imagination, and sensibility. This encounter is capable of leading the observers to their own meanings and interpretations. Creating work that invites participation in this mysterious process is her goal, and a meaningful viewer experience is more valuable than any explanation the artist can provide.

Harrison's pieces develop very gradually, with many layers of collage, then paint, then wax, and over again. Harrison says, "An artist is continually making decisions in the process of making, but also I find myself thinking about what prompted me to work with these shapes - and as I work and think, my intent strengthens and an explanation emerges. similate into decisions about identity."

Harrison continues, "My favorite way to work is in series, making multiples with a consistent set of parameters. This series has a constant size (10" x 10") and I'm using symmetrically cut papers for the collage. Because I'm working on several pieces at the same time, my paper palette and my paint palette also stay fairly consistent. I find that once these choices are made, I'm able to work with abandon, making decisions quickly." This gives a definite sense of freedom to the images. continued above on next column to the right
