NC Museum of Natural Sciences in Raleigh Offers Works Ben Owen III

Seagrove potter Ben Owen III brings Old *Roots*, *New Branches* to the North Carolina Museum of Natural Sciences' Nature Art Gallery, from May 1 - 31, 2015. A reception will be held on May 1, from 6-8:30pm.

The exhibition features a collection of beautiful pieces made from North Carolina clay and fired in the North Carolina pottery tradition. The collection also provides an opportunity to purchase a thing of beauty and lasting value made by the hands of a preeminent North Carolina artisan.

Owen was born into a traditional Seagrove, NC, pottery family, and was first introduced to clay by his grandfather when he was eight years old. Since the age of 13, he has been selling pots from Ben Owen Pottery, a business established by his father and grandfather. Throughout high school he produced works using the traditions and glazes of his grandfather, who was influenced by the Asian pottery traditions he admired in museum collections.

Like his grandfather, Owen's work displays both traditional and Asian influences. He has exhibited his work continually since 1993 in both group and solo shows in North Carolina, Dallas and New York, as well as China and Japan. He has also been featured on "Good Morning America," PBS, Japan-TV, Korean-TV and several TV shows in China.

Though most North Carolinians are familiar with Ben Owen III, few are aware that his reputation has spread so far beyond the state and country. His work has been commissioned by Ronald Reagan, Elizabeth Taylor, Perry Como, Bob Hope, Tom Selleck and Arnold Palmer. Most recently, the University of North Carolina commissioned him to create a piece for musician James Taylor as a lifetime achievement award. Other public collections include the North Carolina Governor's Mansion, Raleigh; the Umstead Hotel, Cary; plus Ritz-Carlton Hotels of Boston, Tokyo and White Plains, NY; Boston Commons and the Federal Reserve,

Adam Cave Fine Art in Raleigh, NC, Features Works by Byron Gin

Adam Cave Fine Art in Raleigh, NC, is presenting *BYRON GIN / emergence*, on view through May 26, 2015. A reception will be held on May 1, from 6-9pm.

Combining abstract color-field painting with realist still-life and nature elements has been the focus of Chicago artist Byron Gin for many years now. In his newest body of work, Gin creates backgrounds full of color and texture.

The history of the paint, layer upon layer, is visible in each piece, and reminiscent of the peeling paint, plaster, and paper one finds on the walls of old buildings. The birds and objects that populate these paintings are sometimes not fully painted, and seem to appear out of the paint like old stickers, signs, or graffiti. However, Gin has painted these elements with even more detail than ever before, creating striking contrasts that bring each piece to life.
