Originally from a small French town in Ontario, now calling Bluffton home, Wood began her exploration of photography doing portraits for her family, something she still enjoys today. She started with a DSLR camera in 2008 and has since discovered wildlife, landscape and macro photography. Bender Gallery in Asheville, NC, Features Works by Chad Holliday

The Bender Gallery in Asheville, NC, will present *Primordial Forms*, a solo exhibition of contemporary cast glass sculpture by distinguished artist Chad Holliday, on view from June 6 through July 31, 2014. A reception will be held on June 6, from 5-8pm.

Holliday says, "The foundation for my work lies within the understanding of primordial forms and their purpose throughout history. These are the forms that are repeated throughout history by different and separate cultures for a similar purpose." He has linked this concept to the aesthetics of Czech glass (where he received much of his training) as well as merging in elements of Cubism and Constructivism.

In his work, Holliday employs "a repeating dialogue incorporating space and time, using visual elements that are inherent in solid cast glass". Sculpture is

by definition three dimensional. Holliday integrates the fourth dimension...time... in his work as well as adding a "fifth dimension", using light to play upon the interior of the object.

Holliday's work is pure in form and color. Much of the imagery captured in the sculptures is derived from the architecture of gothic cathedrals found throughout Europe. These circles, arches, passages and buttresses form a schema that replays itself in different forms throughout the work. The artist's use of a single bold color adds to the strength of each piece.

Pointed Arch Composing Green and Yellow depicts the composition of a pointed or ogival arch, one of the defining characteristics of Gothic architecture. The arch has been broken apart and segmented rendering it asymmetrical. A circular form at the top gives rise to the sculpture, much continued on Page 12
