Company of Toledo, OH, for over 20 years. Their collection includes over 400 bottles produced by important American glass houses such as Steuben, Cambridge, Frye and Imperial. The majority of the collection features bottles manufactured between 1924-1929, when Art Deco was at its height in America and Europe.

The Spartanburg Art Museum worked with Jay Kaplan to develop a series of Lunch and Learn presentations to help educate our community about the incredibly diverse nature of glass, both from a historical perspective and contemporary one. "It's been wonderful working with Jay", Goddard comments.
