group of sixteen artists have created in the last decade. Encaustic, oil on panel, ceramic, jewelry, sculpture, photography and more grace the walls and floors of the gallery in this exciting show and the work reflects well on this cooperative effort.

The ArtBomb Studio is an informal organization of dedicated, professional artists in West Greenville, SC. In 2000, they joined forces to work under one roof in individual studios. That roof covers a large brick building at 1320 Pendleton Street, which had once been the general store for families working at the historic Brandon Mills textile company, long out of business.

At the ArtBomb, studio life buzzes with 16 artists, each working independently in a variety of disciplines. It is the ideal environment for creativity. Each artist exhibits in many regional galleries and museums, including Art & Light and Greenville County Museum of Art, Greenville; Upstairs Artspace, Tryon; and Eastside 64, Cashiers. Some show in venues in Columbia, Atlanta, Charlotte and beyond. Most are in private and corporate collections.

Carolina Creations in New Bern, NC, will present *Summer Solace*, featuring painting by Raleigh, NC, artist Nancy McClure, on view from July 1 through Aug. 31, 2017. A reception will be held on July 14, from 5-8pm, during the downtown Art Walk.

Nancy C. McClure is a contemporary North Carolina artist painting in oils and acrylics. She has always been involved in the arts from a young age and then formally through her education. After graduating from Syracuse University with a Bachelors in Merchandising, she went to Georgia State to pursue a degree in Studio Art.

McClure relocated to Raleigh, where she met her co-owner of ArtSource Fine Art gallery. She has been surrounded by art for over three decades and decided to pursue her own love of painting with an impressionist style. Most of her imagery is related to the coast and southern landscapes. She also enjoys painting large scale abstracts as well as still lifes from life.

McClure's love of the outdoors and especially the beach, where she spends her weekends, is seen in much of her imagery. She is inspired by the early morning light and late afternoon light creating shadow seen in her landscapes. McClure works from her own photographs for inspiration,

and paints en plein air as well as in her studio. Her beautiful still life series are always painted from life. McClure's abstracts have a bright acrylic underpainting and in some cases an intentional texture that is visible even after the last stroke of oil.
