The Coastal Discovery Museum on Hilton Head Island, SC, is presenting An Eye for History, Visions of Honey Horn, on view in the Hilton Head Regional Healthcare Gallery, through Aug. 31,

To celebrate its 30th anniversary, the Coastal Discovery Museum will host an exhibition that reveals Honey Horn's beauty, history, and heritage as seen by a wide variety of artists. Two and three dimensional artwork depicting, or inspired by, the unique Honey Horn site, may be submitted for consideration. A few examples of subject matter include: historic buildings, former (or current) residents, recent activities, natural scenery, and historic events.

Honey Horn plantation's name dates back to the late 1780s when the Hanahan family from Edisto Island, SC, owned the property. The Graham family built a home on site (currently part of the Discovery House) in 1859. Throughout the late 19th century and the first half of the 20th century, the property hosted gatherings of northern hunters during the winter months. Many of the property's historic buildings date to the hunting era. Between 1950 and 1998 the Hack family lived at Honey Horn leaving their legacy on the

entire Island. Shortly after the Town of Hilton Head Island purchased the property in 1998, the Coastal Discovery Museum began planning to open the property to the public. After several years of fund-raising, planning, and renovations, the Coastal Discovery Museum at Honey Horn opened in 2007.

Since then, dozens of arts groups have worked on and exhibited on site, tens of thousands of school aged visitors have attended programs, over hundreds of thousands of visitors have toured exhibits, and numerous special events, weddings, and community gatherings have taken place at Honey Horn. This exhibition will showcase the property's last 150 years through historic images, artifacts, two and three dimensional artwork, and displays. The natural beauty and historic character of Honey Horn has inspired artists over the years.

Art League of Hilton Head Island, SC, Features Works by Zach Grether


