subject for a series of articles that he contributed to *Juxtapoz* magazine.

At the end of 2020, Molesky traveled to Iceland at the invitation of a prominent collector. What was supposed to be a relatively short visit turned into a six month adventure as he was awarded several artist residency programs. During this time of dedicated focus, he further developed his "unfinished" series. These paintings on linen bring a contemporary twist to the tradition of figurative painting by remixing elements from Post-Impressionist drawing with Baroque oil techniques and composition. Through the exposure of the various layers of his process - even down to raw linen - the paintings

engage the viewer to fill in the gaps. The visual result of the figure and background appearing to share materiality reinforces Molesky's aim to depict states of elevated oneness within their environments.

The galleries operate on a schedule, which coincides with the Barton academic year. Generally the galleries are open from mid-August to mid-May and are occasionally open for receptions and events during the summer months.
