Spoonbill Gallery in Greenville, SC, Features Works by Michelle Radford

Spoonbill Gallery in Greenville, SC, will present, Life, Labor, Laundry, Lace: Collaborating with Women of the Past, a solo exhibition by local artist Michelle Radford, on view from Feb. 7 through Mar. 1, 2025. A reception will be held on Feb. 7, from 6-9pm.

The exhibition explores the intersection of landscape painting and domestic textiles, highlighting the overlooked artistry of women's domestic work throughout history.

For centuries, women have expressed their creativity and skill through textiles, often in private spaces, their labor undervalued as an art form. Radford honors these anonymous makers by weaving their handmade lace doilies and vintage textiles into her landscape paintings, giving their work a new stage.

"I begin these pieces by sourcing vintage textiles," Radford shares. "Often, they are entrusted to me by women who have received them as heirlooms. These doily donors know each piece represents countless hours of careful work by an ancestor, and they want the objects to be enjoyed and appreciated. When I incorporate one of these textiles into my artwork, I am putting on display the creative work of an anonymous woman. I rarely know who the maker is, but I can imagine she was a woman not unlike myself."



Radford's practice is deeply personal, rooted in her experiences as both an artist and a mother. "I began my studio practice as a landscape painter, but after becoming a mother of three, I found that textiles were more forgiving than oils while caring for babies. I returned to the sewing and crafting techniques I had learned from my mother and grandmother and made conceptual work about domestic life and my experience of motherhood.'

Radford's current work merges her two passions, reflecting the "countless repetitions of women in the home" and the beauty born from those cycles of labor.

"The countless crochet knots in a doily echo the endless cycles of laundry, the ongoing labor to bring order to chaos, and the daily liturgy of meal preparation," she explains. "I have lamented that

my domestic efforts seem to vanish in the wind, but the accumulated stitches in these doilies remind me that domestic repetitions accumulate as well. The results of my labors can be seen in the lives of the loved ones I care for over time.'

Each piece in this exhibition is a collaboration across time, space, and generations. By incorporating heirloom textiles, Radford reactivates forgotten labor, ensuring that the beauty and skill of women's work continue to inspire and delight.

Radford's Life, Labor, Laundry, Lace: Collaborating with Women of the Past offers a poignant reflection on the artistry of women, the legacy of domestic labor, and the power of memory.

Michelle Radford is a multi-disciplinary artist living in Greenville, SC. She holds an MFA in Painting from the Savannah College of Art and Design. Radford began her studio practice as a landscape painter; however, after becoming a mother of three she began making work about the meaning of motherhood and domestic spaces through her mixed media assemblages and collages. Her most recent work explores combining landscape with textiles usually associated with women and domesticity. Combining fine art and craft has become a metaphor for weaving together her callings as an artist and
