photography classes transformed him into a self-proclaimed “darkroom rat.” He took every available photography class in the Art and Journalism Schools at USC and excelled at his new passion. Weekends often found him on the road to remote mountain areas of his native state North Carolina, photographing the people and landscapes of Appalachia.

Edwards began his freelance photography business in 1995 and has been capturing the landscapes and portraits of the Charleston area ever since.

He taught photography at the Gibbes Museum Studio for several years and has worked as a freelance photographer since 1989. His work has been published nationally, locally and widely exhibited. Publications and venues include *Piccolo Spoleto Outdoor Art Exhibition*; *Charleston Magazine*; Gibbes Museum of Art, Charleston, SC; McKissick Museum of Art, Columbia, SC; Tiemakers Gallery, Charleston, SC; and *Southern Visions* exhibit, York County Museum, York, SC.

Corrigan Gallery represents local artists with a few visiting and second market artists. From the edge of traditional to as “contemporary” as is feasible, the gallery presents works with thought and depth particularly in a nontraditional manner. experience in France. His career as a commercial architect and humanitarian missions’ architect has profoundly influenced his artistic style, allowing him to convey the beauty of both urban and rural settings through his brush.

Since retiring to Beaufort, SC, Gorman has produced over 300 acrylic and oil canvases, with nearly 150 pieces sold to art lovers. His work prominently features the breathtaking coastal scenes of South Carolina, inspired by local treasures such as Hunting Island Beach, Hilton Head’s Coligny Beach, and the Broad River Basin. Recently, he has also begun exploring themes of historic architecture and narrative painting.

Gorman’s artwork has been recognized with the honor of being the Featured Artist in five exhibitions, and his pieces are currently displayed in 12 locations throughout the Beaufort/Savannah area, including galleries, businesses, churches, restaurants, and museum and State Park gift shops. He is also a former President of the Beaufort Art Association.
