Along with studying and maintaining a fine art studio, he worked as a freelance muralist. Eventually, Garey and another artist, Dianne Warner, established a large commercial mural studio. He also painted custom signs and gold leaf work for businesses.

Upon returning to Florence in 2011, Garey established a local studio, and continued painting in fine art, portraits, sign painting, and mural work. His most recent mural work is the commission for the large narrative mural located in the lobby of the

The Seagrove Wood Fire NC, a two-day driving tour of Seagrove, NC, celebrates the role of wood firing in the creation of ceramics, will be held at the Seagrove Potteries the first weekend in June. June 7-8, from 10am - 5pm. The event is free. We welcome wood fired pottery enthusiasts to enjoy a self-guided tour featuring fifteen wood fire potters in our community.

Learn about the process of firing with wood and discover the extensive array of effects each potter renders from the atmosphere inside a wood firing.

Some of the kilns take nearly a week to fire, stoking them with wood every 10 minutes or so. Volatile compounds including molten ash float and flash onto surfaces, building up and creating effects which can dramatically or subtly enhance a pot.
