

Arts Council of York County in Rock Hill, SC, Offers Annual Juried Show and More

The Arts Council of York County in Rock Hill, SC, is presenting the 35th Annual Juried Competition Exhibition, juried by Wofford College's Rebecca Forstater, on view in the Dalton Gallery at the Center for the Arts, through Aug. 24, 2024. A reception and awards ceremony will be held on Aug. 8, from 5:30-7:30pm.

Each year, the Annual Juried Competition is open internationally to artists 18 and older. Only original work, created in the last two (2) years, and not previously shown at the Center for the Arts, Dalton Gallery is accepted. All forms of media are eligible, including video.

This year, there were 204 entries by 84 artists from 30 cities and 4 states. Of those entries, juror Rebecca Forstater selected 35 works by 29 artists from 16 cities and 4 states to be displayed in the 35th Annual Juried Competition Exhibition.

Rebecca Forstater (she/they) is a South Carolina-based interdisciplinary artist who considers the production of current histories in digital landscapes through digital sculpture and video performances. Her work focuses on the shaping of collective memory through pop culture, memes, and AI bots that circulate the internet. nationally with most recent shows at the 701 Center for Contemporary Art (South Carolina), Hangaram Design Museum (Seoul), Future Fair (NYC), Tiger Strikes Asteroid (Los Angeles), and Governors Island (New York). Currently, Forstater is an Assistant Professor of Studio Art at Wofford College and serves on the board of the New Media Caucus.

Awards to be won include: the Gerald & Barbara Schapiro Best of Show at \$1,000; 1st Place at \$750; 2nd Place at \$500; and 3rd Place at \$250. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Awards are sponsored by Kathy and Larry Wilson

On view in the Perimeter Gallery is the exhibit, *MUGSHOT*, featuring works by fifteen regional ceramic artists, on view through Aug. 24, 2024. A reception will be held on Aug. 8, beginning at 5:30pm

Hickory Museum of Art in Hickory, NC, Features Works by Michael C. Thorpe

The Hickory Museum of Art in Hickory, NC, is presenting *Michael C. Thorpe: NO EXPECTATIONS*, on view in the Museum's Coe Gallery, through Nov. 10, 2024.

The Hickory Museum of Art's newest exhibition features work by college basketball MVP turned textile artist Michael C Thorpe. Quilting is a skill passed on intergenerationally by the matriarchs of Thorpe's family who were part of the quilting community in New England. He tells stories about his world expressed in quilts of colorful fabric, meandering stitching and printed canvas, and playful pencil and stitched drawings. Thorpe's subsequent discovery of the Gee's Bend community of women quilters in Alabama offered the artist deeper personal meaning in his chosen medium and a connection to his heritage.

The exhibition will explore the interconnectedness of Thorpe's passions - the creative process and basketball. "What happens in basketball is so parallel to what happens in art.... because you have to work so hard when nobody's watching, just for that chance to get that moment to shine that one shot, that one show", said Michael C. Thorpe.

The Museum is collaborating with local school systems to turn education inside out by directly connecting local students with a world of opportunities. Kindergarten through High School field trip tours will focus on standards in the visual arts in global, historical, societal, and cultural contexts, along with interdisciplinary connections and life applications. The creative process will be taught as the necessary tool

for pursuing one's dreams in addition to the soft and workforce-ready skills needed for success.
