


Springs, NC, Features Works by **Richard Mathis & Lumbee Artists**

Red Springs Artspace in Red Springs, NC, is proud to present two shows running concurrently to celebrate Lumbee Homecoming. The works by all eight artists will be on view through July 20, 2025.

The first is a solo exhibition entitled *The* Land Remembers: Layers of Heritage, featuring works by North Carolina-based artist Richard Mathis. "I'm honored to exhibit during Lumbee Homecoming," says Mathis. "And to do so at Red Springs Artspace - a gallery that honors both tradition and experimentation - is especially meaningful.'

Mathis' striking photomontages explore themes of memory, identity, and place - reflecting on how heritage is carried forward across generations and deeply rooted in the land. His layered imagery creates a powerful visual language that speaks to both personal and collective histories.

In addition to Mathis' work, the gallery will host an exhibition of seven Lumbee artists, showcasing a dynamic range of visual expressions tied to Native culture, history, and community. This exhibition, Creative Voices of Lumbee Artists, will showcase artworks by Ned Barton, Joan Blackwell, Bea Brayboy, Nancy Johnson, Karina Mc-Millan, Lisa Oxendine, and Betty Oxendine Mangum. Together, the two exhibitions offer a rich and timely dialogue on cultural
