Space Makers is part of the rich ta of work by artists with disabilities in North Carolina. There are limitless ways that disability impacts how we navigate the world, and the works created by these artists reflect that variety in abundance. In the exhibition, artists with disabilities claim their voices and command space through visual, experiential, and often experimental artwork.

Space Makers: Art and Disability in North Carolina offers museum visitors a glimpse into the world of each artist, engaging the viewer in a conversation about what it means to navigate a landscape of access and ability.

The exhibition features over 60 works by Meredith Connelly, Mitzie Jokich, Wiley Johnson, Rachard McIntyre, Devon McKnight, Maria McKnight, Jean Gray Mohs, Savannah Nemeth, Eliza Redmann, Terry Schupbach-Gordon, Shannon Silva, and Sarah Simmons.

Cameron Art Museum had the honor of working with Aaron Wicox as he curated the works by eleven contemporary artists in a variety of mediums for this exhibition. Wilcox, Chair of UNCW's Art & Art His-

tory Departments, says, "[Space Makers] is full of artists who are contributing to that change and making space for themselves. These talented individuals are just a few in a massive community of makers with disabilities who think and act and create through a different perspective than often crosses our paths. No matter what type of art they are making, they are making themselves known."
