A master of atmosphere, mood, and light, famed Charleston, SC, artist Linda Fantuzzo is represented by more than twenty paintings drawn from her most recent body of work in a new exhibition "Linda Fantuzzo: Penumbra". The landscape and interior paintings and drawings in this exhibition are rendered with a quiet, abstracted simplicity. The inclusion of stairs, ladders, windows, and doors suggests an unseen yet palpable human presence. The title "Penumbra", a term that means "a space of partial illumination," references light's transitions.
